3. PERSONAL STATEMENT

Professor Emmanuel B. Kasimbazi is a leading African scholar of environmental and natural resources law whose work has significantly shaped legal and policy frameworks on climate change, disaster risk reduction, water governance, biodiversity conservation, and human rights across Africa and beyond. His scholarship integrates doctrinal analysis, institutional design, and community-centred governance to advance legal frameworks grounded in equity, sustainability, and the protection of vulnerable populations.

Over a distinguished career spanning more than three decades, Professor Kasimbazi has produced an extensive and influential body of work, including three books, over 30 book chapters, and 19 peer-reviewed articles. Published by leading academic presses such as Oxford, Cambridge, Routledge, and Springer, International, Springer and Edward Elgar research has elevated African perspectives within global legal discourse. His foundational texts, including *Energy Law in Uganda* and *Environmental Law in Uganda*, remain authoritative references for sustainable governance in the region.

Professor Kasimbazi's impact extends well beyond academia. Through his leadership at Makerere University and advisory roles with the United Nations,

regional institutions, and national governments, he has directly contributed to the development of more than fifteen national and regional laws and policies. These span critical areas such as climate change, REDD+, wetlands management, land governance, disaster risk management, and energy regulation. His work has been particularly influential in shaping transboundary water governance in the Nile Basin and advancing innovative legal frameworks for disaster risk management across Africa.

A scholar-practitioner of international standing, Professor Kasimbazi is a Fellow of The World Academy of Sciences (TWAS), the African Academy of Sciences, and the Uganda National Academy of Sciences. He is also a Fulbright Scholar and recipient of the 2020 Scientist of the Year award from the International Achievements Research Centre. His ongoing engagement with global expert networks, including the IUCN World Commission on Environmental Law, underscores his leadership in international environmental law and governance.

Professor Kasimbazi's scholarship has helped articulate an emerging environmental jurisprudence of the Global South, grounded in principles of justice, equity, and sustainable development. He has consistently advocated for fair resource distribution and the meaningful inclusion of marginalized communities in environmental decision-making, particularly in the context of climate change.

Through the integration of rigorous scholarship, policy influence, and normative leadership, Professor Kasimbazi has made a transformative contribution to the development of environmental law and governance in Africa and globally.
